CIRCULAR ON BIOMEDICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT

1. It is essential to emphasize that the responsibility of biomedical waste segregation lies with every single member of our healthcare system including physicians, medical interns, nursing officers, and other ancillary staff.
2. Metal sharp wastes (such as needles, blades, etc) must never be segregated/disposed of in the **yellow and red bins** under any circumstances.
3. If any missegregation of biomedical wastes is observed during a field visit, it will be documented. The duty nursing officer of the ward is responsible for signing the duly filled incident form of improper segregation. It is essential to clarify that the nursing officer's signature in the incident report does not imply their involvement in the missegregation; rather, it is an official acknowledgement of the missegregation noted in their ward.
4. All instances of improper segregation of biomedical waste will be documented. A consolidated report will be published from time to time with the approval of the competent authority.
5. The Faculty In-charge of IPD wards may organize corrective measures based on the statistics of published improper segregation of the ward concerned, if deemed necessary.
